JB Dondolo, Inc. is a nonprofit organization founded by Dondolo's children in November 2012. The organization is named after the late father, JB Dondolo, an orphan, farmer, and humanitarian advocate whose values and principles on giving continue to inspire his children, friends, and families across the world. JB Dondolo played a critical role in the fight against poverty in his community and Dondolo's children saw the need to form this organization in honor of their father so his legacy of good deeds continues.



OUR MISSION

Our mission is to remove barriers of access to clean water, sanitation, and hygiene in underserved and impoverished communities to reduce poverty and promote gender equity.

OUR VISION

Our vision is to see a world where clean water is not an obstacle to pursuing a better and more equitable life.

OUR VALUES

We believe in the legacy of giving and helping marginalized communities because we know everyone deserves the chance to have a better life. We believe this legacy will help advance equity, enrich lives, and create a positive ripple effect for future generations to come.

OUR APPROACH

At JB Dondolo, we finish what has been started but left incomplete due to hardships (death, illness, no means to fund). We work on the critical needs first and use an active listening approach to addressing needs by working with expert partners to make informed decisions and implement programs and innovations effectively, sustainably, and to scale. Our interest is in those projects that promote community growth and a better future for everyone.

Our current countries of focus are Zimbabwe and the United States. The truth is that regardless of whether a nation is industrialized or not, people in need are everywhere. Private and public agencies are there but possess limited resources and cannot provide for every community in need of assistance or basic necessities. This leaves a large segment of the low-income population with unmet needs that we are here to help with.

DEAR FRIENDS: A LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDER


Dear Friends,

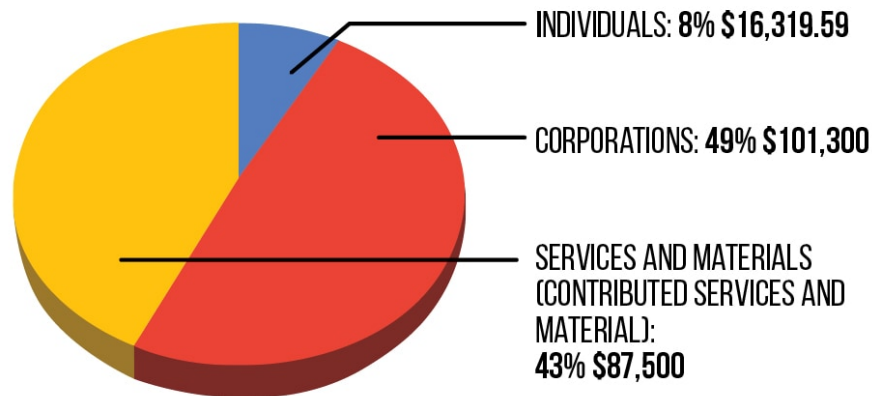

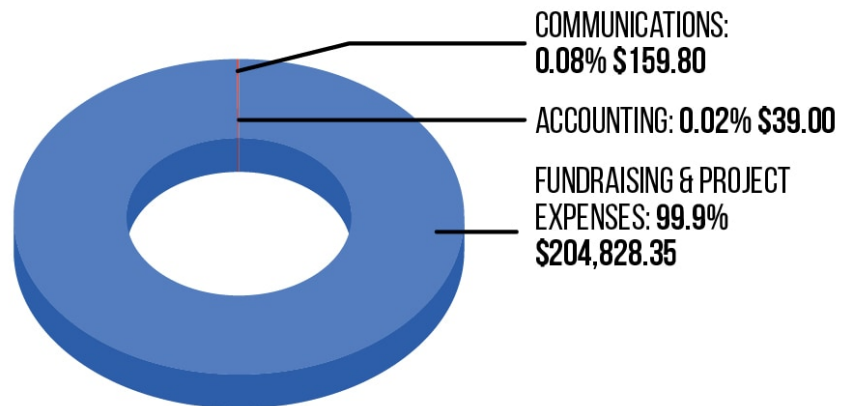
Total Expenses: \$205,027.15

2021 IMPACT TIMELINE

JANUARY- FEBRUARY — SWEET COMPASSION

JB Dondolo along with its youth ambassadors 2 Bros in a Kitchen aimed to lift up local school teachers' spirits with gift bags of cookies and sanitation supplies.

For International Women's History Month, JB Dondolo donated 28,300 feminine hygiene products, 100 face masks, and 100 hand sanitizers to provide relief for underserved women and girls affected by the Texas winter storm.

JB Dondolo hosted its 2nd annual Music for Water fundraiser and international song competition, 3,991 maxipads and 1,000 tampons benefiting the unhoused population on Skid Row in Los Angeles, CA.

NOVEMBER — MATOBO HILLS, ZIMBABWE

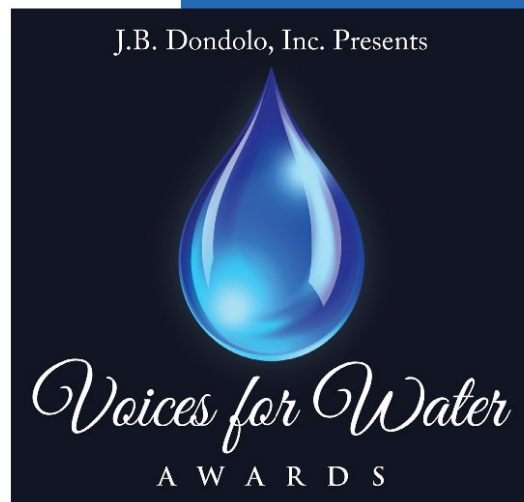
WATER RELIEF

JB Dondolo worked in Matobo Hills with value partners to provide access to clean water to over 16,000 residents mainly comprised of women and girls by drilled 3 boreholes, 2 to enable with solar energy for agriculture solutions.

The Voices for Water Awards celebration honored extraordinary water changemakers who significantly advanced JB Dondolo's mission to provide access to clean water.



PROJECT HIGHLIGHT: TEXAS WINTER STORM RELIEF

PROVIDING RELIEF TO TEXAS:

On March 8, 2021 for International Women's History Month, JB Dondolo donated 28,300 feminine hygiene products, 100 face masks (in partnership with Vi Bella and Fashion Community Foundation) and 100 hand sanitizers (in partnership with Disinfect & Shield) to I Support the Girls - Houston who helps provide relief to underserved women and girls affected by the Texas winter storm. This crisis left the state grappling with broken water pipes, food insecurity and an electrical outage causing 3.3 million people to lose power. JB Dondolo, Inc. is headquartered in Texas so rising to the occasion was not only an imperative, but a matter close to home. As a result, we helped make an impact on over 1,300 lives.

WHY WE CHOSE HOUSTON:

In a report done by the University of Houston Institute for Research on Women, Gender & Sexuality (IRWGS), it was found that the quality-of-life gap between men and women were significant on multiple fronts in Harris County. For example, women's poverty rate (15.3%) was nearly 50% higher than the male poverty rate (10.4%).



MUSIC FOR WATER COMPETITION

ABOUT THE COMPETITION:

JB Dondolo hosted its 2nd annual Music for Water fundraiser and international song competition! Music for Water represents a campaign that streamed water and music together with the intent to align the mission of JB Dondolo to ignite a greater awareness of the importance of potable water, sanitation, and hygiene around the globe.

Due to COVID-19, JB Dondolo recognizes the importance of raising funds to help those in dire need. Therefore, the recipient of the funds raised benefited the unhoused population on Skid Row in Los Angeles, CA. Current hygiene services make it possible to give everyone living on Skid Row a chance to shower once every 3-5 days, yet access to hygiene remains one of the most critical barriers to restoring people's dignity and health in this area. JB Dondolo partnered with Disinfect & Shield, I Support the Girls, and Grand Mountain International Records to help bring sanitation and hygiene to this community.





To celebrate the competition, this year we hosted our "Music for Water" Awards Gala held on October 16th. The past and current winners were featured alongside special entertainment guests, award-winning artists, and our community partners.

OUR WINNERS:

Our top 3 winners hail from around the world with different styles and backgrounds, yet their love for music and a noteworthy cause unites them, and us, all. Our grand prize winner is music artist Valentine Nokutenda Hangazha, whose stage name is Valeen X, from Zimbabwe with the submission "They used to Be"! Third place is won by is music artist Sincere Porter from the USA with the submission "We're One".

CLEAN WATER FOR MATOBO HILLS, ZIMBABWE



The need for boreholes to provide fresh water to communities in Matobo where water is scarce was brought to JB Dondolo by Dot Bekker who collaborates with the local community. Women and girls bear the responsibility of collecting water in underserved communities and in Matobo Hills, a community of women and girls walk up to 18 miles each day to attain water. The water they fetch is unsafe for human consumption but to survive they are left with no other choice. Having potable water close to their residences would prevent sicknesses, girls can attend school, and women can pursue careers.

By providing access to clean water, however, not only will these women and girls be given relief, but an entire community of 90,000 would benefit. The community Councillor had presented 6 potential sites which had

already been identified by the Matobo Regional District Council (MRDC) and JB Dondolo accepted the challenge to have these drilled.

Whilst 6 sites were initially identified, issues with funding postponed the project, yet it was decided to initiate 3 sites which were agreed with the Councillor and Village Head. These sites are listed below.

- **Silozwana: Drilled, cased, and capped to 60 meters.**
 - Yield: +800 litres an hour
 - Verdict: insufficient to sustain any market garden project. Sufficient to provide clean water for the local community and livestock. An alternative composting project may be possible
- **Pale: Hole 2 drilled in Pale: Drilled and cased and capped to 60 meters.**
 - Yield: +- 2500 litres an hour
 - Verdict: sufficient for community and livestock as well potential exists for a limited agriculture project, this is to be assessed further as to which would be most practical and require limited water.
- **Tombo: Drilled to 65 meters. Cased to 6 meters.**
 - Borehole was unfortunately dry but is safe with the 6 meters of casing.
 - Verdict: awaiting DDF report to ascertain the agent's opinion whether further drilling has potential.

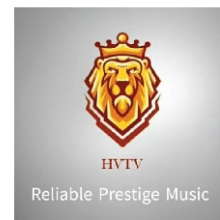
