JB Dondolo, Inc. is a nonprofit organization founded by Lumbie Mlambo in 2016. The organization is named after the late father, JB Dondolo, an orphan, farmer, and humanitarian advocate whose values and principles on giving continue to inspire his children, friends, and families across the world. JB Dondolo played a critical role in the fight against poverty in his community and Lumbie saw the need to form this organization in honor of their father so his legacy of good deeds continues.

We remove barriers of access to clean water, sanitation, and hygiene in underserved and impoverished communities to reduce poverty, provide economic opportunities and room for development and promote gender equity. We focus on women and girls who are the most vulnerable people in these low-income communities to get them out of the cycle of poverty with collection of water. We see a world where clean water is not an obstacle to pursuing a better and more equitable life.

- To create 10 million job opportunities driven by technology innovations



OUR APPROACH

At JB Dondolo, we finish what has been started but left incomplete due to hardships (death, illness, no means to fund). We work on the critical needs first and use an active listening approach to addressing needs by working with expert partners to make informed decisions and implement programs and innovations effectively, sustainably, and to scale. Our interest is in those projects that promote community growth and a better future for everyone.

Our current countries of focus are Zimbabwe and the United States. The truth is that regardless of whether a nation is industrialized or not, people in need are everywhere. Private and public agencies are there but possess limited resources and cannot provide for every community in need of assistance or basic necessities. This leaves a large segment of the low-income population with unmet needs that we are here to help with.

As we take on additional initiatives, our influence spreads more and farther across the world. Our mission and vision are very important to us.

2022 was a lovely year, but it wasn't without difficulties. I'm happy to report that we kept putting our attention on helping communities without access to water. To that end, we launched the "100 Voices for Our Planet" initiative to encourage conscious living and the preservation of the ecosystem. Our four annual initiatives—Music for Water (MFW), Voices for Water (VFW), Water for Matobo Hills, and Igusi Clinic Sanitation—were also worked on both online and offline. I'm pleased to say we emerged stronger with our value partners than we were before. Even after returning from the COVID-19 epidemic, it wasn't easy, but we managed to do what some might consider impossible.

Each and every aspect of existence depends on water. We have voluntarily committed to accelerate progress in the second halves of both the Water Action Decade 2018-2028 and 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development specified by the UN. On that note, our [Water Action Agenda](#), "100 Voices for Our Planet" has been published on the UN Partnerships for SDGs platform. To lessen the devastation of eco-systems brought on by a variety of manmade activities, it is essential to conserve the environment. Protecting the environment from pollution and other activities that cause environmental degradation is more of a moral imperative for humans.

Our plan for 2023 is to keep working on our water projects in Zimbabwe, Africa, and to keep offering water solutions while stepping up our own revenue-generating initiatives to support the long-term viability of our company. 



2022 IMPACT TIMELINE

MARCH-APRIL — MATOBO HILLS, ZIMBABWE WATER RELIEF AND SANITATION

JB Dondolo worked in Matobo Hills with value partners to provide access to clean water to over 8,000 residents mainly comprised of women and girls: installed 4m tank stand adhering with water safety standards to prevent damage, drilled 1 borehole (however, no yield), distributed sanitary pads to one community.



MARCH-AUGUST — IGUSI CLINIC, ZIMBABWE WATER SURVEY, HYGIENE AND SANITATION


JB Dondolo provided 5 modern toilet equipment to replace existing old technology, sanitary pads for mothers-in-waiting, surveyed for water (borehole siting), drained 4 septic tanks built in 1984 and never drained. Igusi Clinic serves a greater community of 20,000+ people.





APRIL-JUNE — MUSIC FOR WATER COMPETITION

JB Dondolo hosted its 3rd annual Music for Water fundraiser and international song competition, 3 water songs selected to receive one-time international distribution with Grand Mountain International Records (G.M.I.R.), 1 song selected as JB Dondolo “theme” song for 2023.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

MUSIC FOR WATER COMPETITION

ABOUT THE COMPETITION:

JB Dondolo hosted its 3rd annual Music for Water fundraiser and international song competition! Music for Water represents a campaign that streamed water and music together with the intent to align the mission of JB Dondolo to ignite a greater awareness of the importance of potable water, sanitation, and hygiene around the globe.

The recipient of the funds raised benefited the unhoused population on Skid Row in Los Angeles, CA. Current hygiene services make it possible to give everyone living on Skid Row a chance to shower once every 3-5 days, yet access to hygiene remains one of the most critical barriers to restoring people's dignity and health in this area. JB Dondolo partnered with Peggy Beatrice Foundation, and Grand Mountain International Records to help bring sanitation and hygiene to this community.





This year's competition was celebrated along with the Voices for Water Awards in December. The past and current winners were featured alongside special entertainment guests, award-winning artists, and our community partners.



OUR WINNERS:

Our top 3 winners hail from around the world with different styles and backgrounds, yet their love for music and a noteworthy cause unites them, and us, all. CLEAN WATER FOR MATOBO HILLS, ZIMBABWE



The need for boreholes to provide fresh water to communities in Matobo where water is scarce was brought to JB Dondolo by Dot Bekker who collaborates with the local community. Women and girls bear the responsibility of collecting water in underserved communities and in Matobo Hills, a community of women and girls walk up to 18 miles each day to attain water. The water they fetch is unsafe for human consumption but to survive they are left with no other choice. Having potable water close to their residences would prevent illnesses, girls can attend school, and women can pursue careers.

By providing access to clean water, however, not only will these women and girls be given relief, but an entire community of 90,000 would benefit. The community Councillor had presented 6 potential sites which had already been identified by the Matobo Regional District Council (MRDC) and JB Dondolo accepted the challenge to have these drilled.

A total of 4 boreholes so far have been drilled. In 2022, this is the summary of work done:

- **Tombo: Drilled (in 2021) to 65 meters. Cased to 6 meters.**
 - Borehole was unfortunately dry but is safe with the 6 meters of casing.
 - Verdict (2022): According to the DDF report, there is no further drilling as there is no potential for any water yield.
- **Shazhabukwe B: Drilled to 65 meters. No casing.**
 - Borehole was unfortunately dry with rocks.
 - Verdict: There was no potential for any water yield.
- **We replaced the 1 meter tank stand with a 4 meter at borehole #1 for safety reasons.**
- **We gave women and girls period hygiene products**

SANITATION-WATER FOR IGUSI CLINIC, ZIMBABWE

- Igusi Clinic toilets were unusable due to lack of drainage leading to poor sanitation. Our research revealed that the septic tanks built in 1984 had never been drained; they were full. We drained 5 septic tanks to make the toilets usable.
- We also sited (surveyed) one borehole near the clinic.
- We gave bags of period hygiene products

- Finishing what we started with WASH, we are in the next phase of working to install new flushable toilets, new water pipes, and new beds for mothers-in-waiting.



100 VOICES FOR OUR PLANET

In 2023 we are launching the 100 Voices for Our Planet initiative.

The objective is to get individuals to live intentionally and eco-consciously in order to lessen the devastation of eco-systems brought on by a variety of manmade activities.

WATER FOR MATOBO HILLS WOMEN

- Working in Matobo Hills with partners and possibly NASA to site 3 boreholes using space technology to precisely locate the presence of underground water.
- Installing 3 solar-powered water systems to provide clean water for consumption and economic development for rural communities, benefiting a greater population of 90,000 people consisting of women and girls.


