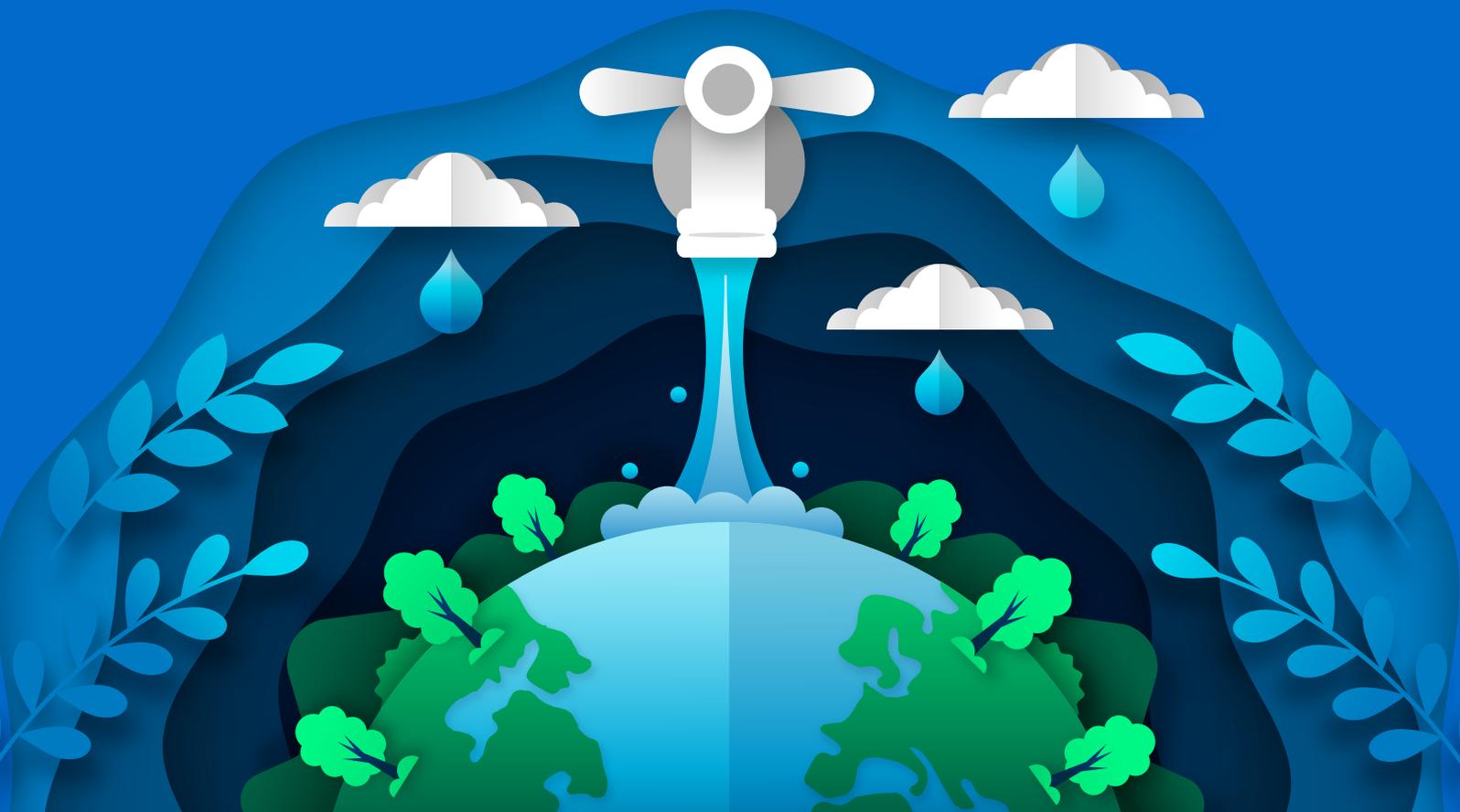

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

It has been over two years since we kickstarted the *100 Voices for Our Planet Engagement and Performance Impact Report*, spotlighting the impactful efforts of eco-conscious entrepreneurs, changemakers, and advocates across various continents.

So far, our initiative expanded its reach and impact, publishing five quarterly reports and one accountability report. These reports are available here - <https://jbdondolo.org/100-voices-for-our-planet>

In this accountability report, we highlight the progress and impact of six Voices from earlier publications

Globally, the *100 Voices for Our Planet* initiative has achieved remarkable milestones:

- Engaged 25 Voices in advocacy, education, and action.
- Planted 7,000+ trees and 400+ community gardens.
- Completed 14 international cleanup projects.
- Provided environmental education to 54 schools.
- Partnered with 21 technology companies.
- Reduced 200 metric tons of carbon emissions.
- Redirected 120,000 pounds of furniture from landfills.
- Produced 20+ tons of briquettes for environmental protection.
- Trained 200 women in biodiversity protection.
- Established 20+ environmental clubs to combat climate change.
- Trained 40 young entrepreneurs in sustainable urban agriculture.

As we advance, we remain committed to empowering Voices across the globe to drive impactful, sustainable change for our planet.

INTRODUCTION

The long-term, data-backed consequences of failing to protect the environment and natural resources are alarming. The UN Climate Change reports a 50% increase in carbon dioxide levels since the pre-industrial era, primarily from human activities. In terms of biodiversity loss, the UN's Global Biodiversity Outlook says that up to one million species are at risk of extinction, impacting ecosystems and human well-being. The UN had earlier warned that by 2025, nearly 1.8 billion people will live in areas with absolute water scarcity, and two-thirds of the world population could face water-stressed conditions. There is an urgent need for sustainable resource consumption to meet global development targets. These are not just headline statistics. At JB Dondolo, there were instances when we faced challenges in supplying clean water to rural communities. We observed that drilling boreholes did not consistently result in access to water, and even when successful, the boreholes often dried up rapidly. Our attempts to install a borehole system in the community were hindered by the fact that 50% of the time, we could not locate water at the aquifer due to prevalent harmful environmental practices in the area. This frustration prompted us to launch the "100 Voices for Our Planet" initiative.

The "100 Voices for Our Planet" initiative is a Water Action Agenda published on the **UN Partnerships for Goals** and available at <https://sdgs.un.org/partnerships/100-voices-our-planet> on the United Nations website. A Voice for Our Planet is anyone passionate about how we live, consume natural resources, protect natural resources, and make natural resources accessible to human beings. Natural resources include water, sanitation, agriculture, fashion, and biogas, to name a few. To lessen the devastation of ecosystems brought on by various man-made activities, it is essential to protect the environment. Protecting the environment from pollution and other activities that cause environmental degradation is more of a moral imperative for humans. Here at JB Dondolo, we make it easy for people in underserved communities to have adequate access to natural resources needed for sustainable consumption and good health.

The ultimate objective of this initiative is for individuals to begin living intentionally. This is the only way to save our Planet. We need the Earth to survive; thus, it is crucial to be environmentally responsible. Living sustainably is what it means to be eco-conscious. You'll need to challenge some of your ingrained beliefs about how to live your life and the world to adopt a more environmentally responsible way of thinking. This initiative aims to inspire everyone to take action to protect our natural resources. You can be a part of this movement. Let us do something together that helps people live better! 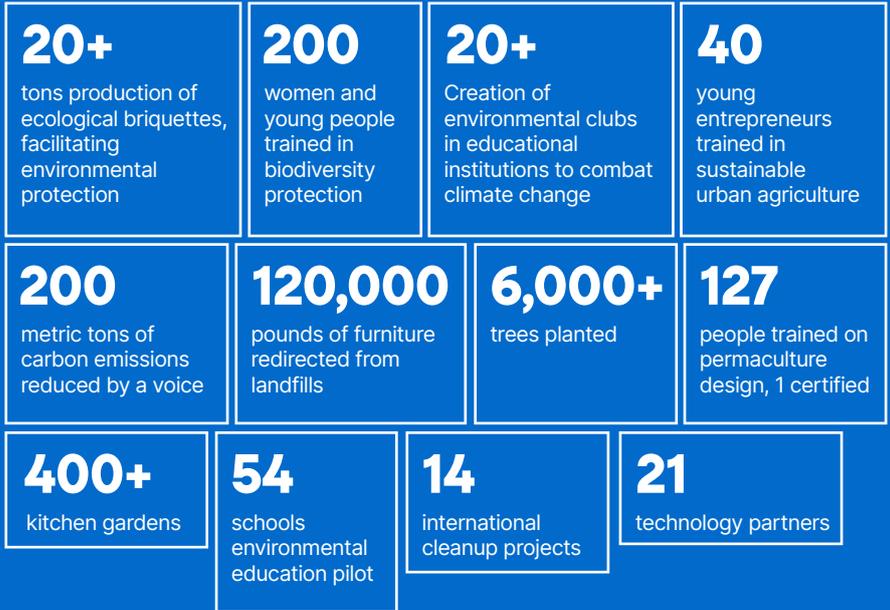

Tell us about your initiative's progress. What impact has it made (in numbers or percentages) Be direct and very clear:

LuxuryByFeyi's initiatives: Promoting a circular economy and regenerative farming practices -through advocacy and the practice of responsible consumption and production through closed-loop production methods to eliminate waste.

We have recently introduced the "Regenerative Farming Practice" as part of our company initiatives. Under this program, for each product sold, two trees will be planted in a suitable, government-approved location in Nigeria. We are initiating this program in Nigeria, where we have

recently opened our first physical store, with plans to expand the practice beyond Nigeria. LuxuryByFeyi's mission is to build an eco-friendly continent.

While:

The Feyiartistry Art Gallery's initiative addresses textile landfill waste to mitigate climate change, conserve natural resources, and stimulate economic growth. This is accomplished by repurposing discarded clothing. Hence, the gallery is dedicated to promoting textile waste upcycling and waste artists and recyclers.

In 2025, the Feyiartistry initiative achieved significant progress, resulting in an over 60% increase in visibility and recognition within the Southampton, England, community, where I am based and studying at the Winchester School of Art, University of Southampton. My Fine Art Master's degree project focused on landfill textile waste consciousness, addressing issues of textile production, consumption, donation, and end-of-life impacts. This project significantly raised awareness among audiences, revealing that many had limited knowledge of the environmental impact of textile waste. My qualitative research methods informed 98% of the 76 interviewees regarding these issues, while the overall exhibition led to a significant increased awareness across England. Consequently, I was selected as one of the top artists to exhibit twice at our final year show and received an invitation to exhibit at the Bristol International Repair Day UK following my degree show. Regarding LuxuryByFeyi's circular economy initiative, our advocacy visibility increased by a minimum of 20%, prompting multiple organisations to reach out for potential partnerships on brand sustainability workshops. We successfully collaborated with one organisation, (late 2024) the Eco Hero Summit and Awards, where we were invited to shine a light on Circular Economy Practices.

Additionally, we were honoured to receive the "Hero Award" in recognition of our efforts in advancing sustainability in fashion and design, presented by Hon. Furthermore, in 2025, LuxuryByFeyi achieved a 70% closed-loop production model, with most of our waste



materials, sample collections, and end-of-life products being repurposed back into both LuxuryByFeyi and Feyiartistry production cycles.

We also completed the construction of the LuxuryByFeyi Fashion Showroom and Feyiartistry Art Gallery in Lagos, where we will expand our impact on textile waste upcycling, circular economy practices, and our new initiative of planting trees—two trees will be planted for each LuxuryByFeyi piece sold.

What’s your goal(s) for 2026?

Our mission is to build an eco-friendly nation through increased outreach in Nigeria regarding circular economy practices, promoting conscious production and consumption, raising awareness about landfill textile waste, and planting trees across Nigeria and potentially Africa. This includes empowering local communities and partnering with like-minded organisations.

Strategic plan for 2026:

1. Launch the LuxuryByFeyi Fashion Showroom and Feyiartistry Art Gallery in Lagos.
2. Develop a new LuxuryByFeyi website to enhance transparency, allowing clients to monitor the progress of tree planting.
3. Create a subscription package for

LuxuryByFeyiconsomers to access rental services, swapping opportunities, and advocacy network dining services, thereby enhancing knowledge of circular economy practices and aiding in data collection about our impact.

4. Partner with like-minded individuals and organisations for the outreach and workshop programs.

Any challenges? If Yes, how did you overcome?

Oh my! The year 2025 presented considerable challenges for me personally, as I balanced my master’s program with demanding projects, family commitments, construction projects, and business operations while striving to maintain ethical standards in Nigeria. Sourcing eco-friendly materials in Nigeria remains a significant challenge; while I recognise that this issue is widespread, the difficulties in sourcing and production are particularly acute in Nigeria, where necessary standard amenities are

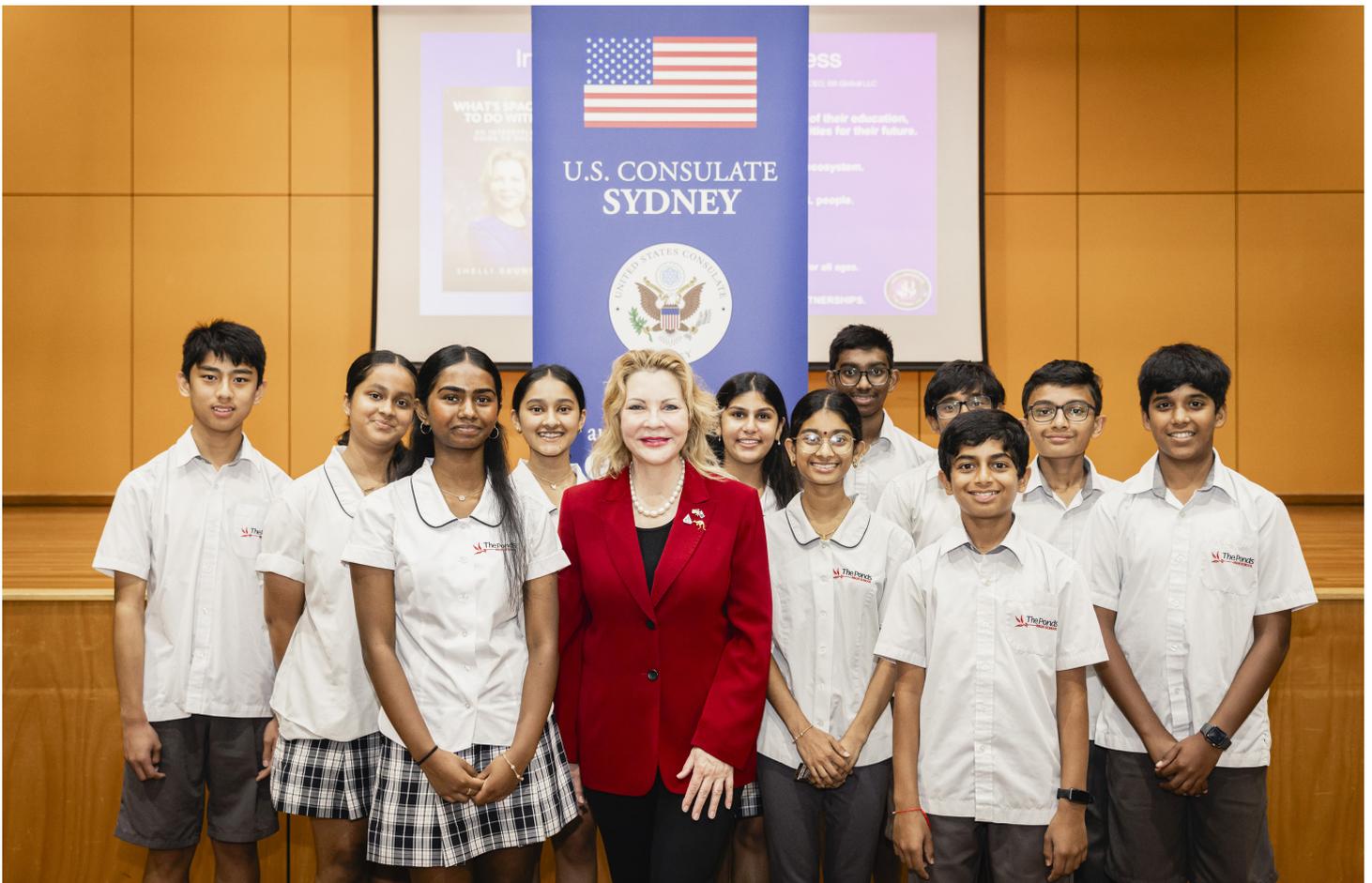

Cathy Dimarchos and her registered social enterprise Solutions2you Pty Ltd continue to self-fund long-term social impact initiatives more than 11 years in the making.

In Tanzania alone in 2025, she has supported over 200 Form 4 students through a leadership program encompassing neuroscience, mindset, communication, negotiation, and personal development, alongside preparing more than 230 pre-university students for life beyond school. This work includes financial literacy, money mindset, presenting skills, effective communication, and time management.

Cathy has also curated and facilitated an Entrepreneurship Hub supporting small businesses across sectors including medical services, innovation, and retail, strengthening foundational frameworks while deepening understanding of

social enterprise and its role in economic security.

In addition, she has trained educators in leadership and financial literacy, embedding a holistic framework that reshapes how we educate, lead, and engage with students and colleagues.

The year also included delivering financial literacy programs to underprivileged girls in Malawi, alongside developing mindset, meditation, and self-regulation skills critical yet often overlooked foundations for long-term empowerment.

What's your goal(s) for 2026?

The work undertaken in 2025 will continue as we continue to fund the same programs.

Tell us about your initiative's progress. What impact has it made (in numbers or percentages) Be direct and very clear:

The home-based permaculture system was established as a one-year pilot to improve household food and ecological resilience.

Prior to implementation, 0% of household vegetables were home-grown, with full reliance on purchased produce. Following implementation, the system produced multiple harvests of kale, spinach, beetroot, and culinary herbs including coriander, sage, mint, and parsley, supplying an estimated 25–30% of household leafy greens during the growing season.

The project operates with 0% synthetic fertilisers or chemical pesticides and has diverted approximately 20–30% of household organic waste into composting. Plant diversity increased from near-zero edible species to over six productive species, with observable increases in pollinator activity and soil cover.

What's your goal(s) for 2026?

My goal for 2026 is to expand the gardening area and have a wider variety of vegetables and herbs, in different permaculture designs that would not only be aesthetic but will also serve many purposes.



Any challenges? If Yes, how did you overcome?

The major challenge was that the garden was in a shady area so the things I could grow were quite limited. The garden expansion will be in an area that receives sun and that should enable me to have a wider variety of plants.

Tell us about your initiative's progress. What impact has it made (in numbers or percentages) Be direct and very clear:

a. GameX Africa Partnership

We formed a partnership with GameX Africa to support children's digital literacy, with a specific emphasis on education for impact. Together, we explored how playful learning and accessible tools can help young people build practical skills and confidence, while connecting those skills to real world community and environmental outcomes. Access to 91 schools, have begun with the first cohort.

b. Toondra Cultural Community Center, Gamified Social Impact and Entrepreneurship

With the Tundra Cultural Community Center, we developed engagement around environmental action through a social impact and entrepreneurship programme delivered via gamification. The work focused on helping young people learn by doing, building problem solving skills, teamwork, and a pathway from awareness to agency.

Within the Uganda linked workstream, early solution themes emerging from the pilots and pitches included clean cooking fuel, organic fertilizer, and recycling. These themes reflect community prioritised needs and demonstrate how gamified

learning can translate into locally relevant enterprise ideas. 6 project ideas were developed and 2 social enterprises are being piloted.

c. Human and AI Collaboration for Sustainability Co Creation

We are also exploring how AI can support the co creation of sustainability solutions, enabling human and AI collaboration and interaction for impact. The goal is to help communities, educators, and innovators move faster from challenges to well structured ideas, prototypes, and learning journeys, while keeping the process transparent, responsible, and inclusive for non technical participants. (pilots in prep for projects in 4 countries)

d. Scaling Prior Work, Strengthening Engagement Loops

Alongside new partnerships, we continued scaling prior projects by improving how audiences discover, understand, and stay involved, including clearer narratives, more usable learning flows, and stronger collaboration touchpoints across partners and pilots.

What’s your goal(s) for 2026?

To scale what we are doing and to become self sustaining

Any challenges? If Yes, how did you overcome?

Resource Constraints: Sustained funding is required to build, market, and deliver engaging learning experiences, retain specialist capability, and measure outcomes consistently across partners and communities.

Digital Infrastructure: Many participants still face barriers to access, including device availability and stable, affordable internet connectivity, which can limit reach and continuity of engagement.

Maintaining Momentum: Long term sustainability depends on strong local ownership, repeatable formats, and ongoing facilitation, so engagement remains active after pilots and events.

Through HAS Handicrafts, our sustainable fashion initiative has showcased collections at 6 international fashion weeks across the UK, France, and the USA, promoting Pakistani craft on global platforms.

We have directly supported and engaged 150+ artisans and women designers, providing fair-trade work and sustainable income opportunities.

Over 70% of our collections are produced using upcycled, recycled, or leftover materials, reducing textile waste and carbon impact. Since launch, we have diverted over 1,000 kg of textile waste from landfills and increased artisan incomes by 40–60% through ethical production and international exposure.

What's your goal(s) for 2026?

In 2026, our goal is to expand HAS Handicrafts into 10+ international markets, showcase our sustainable collections at new global fashion platforms, and increase our use of upcycled and recycled materials to over 85% of total production.

We aim to empower 300+ women artisans, young designers, and youth in fashion and technology through skills training, digital tools, and global exposure. We are committed to building a cleaner, greener, and healthier environment on land and below water by reducing waste, supporting circular fashion, and promoting diversity, equity, climate change and inclusion across all levels of our work.

Any challenges? If Yes, how did you overcome?

We are at an initial level and taking small but meaningful steps to create the best impact for people and the planet. We face challenges in finance and sourcing sustainable materials, but we are overcoming them by building strong community partnerships, promoting upcycling and recycling practices, and supporting artisans with training. These efforts allow us to grow steadily while empowering artisans, protecting the environment, and raising global awareness of sustainable fashion.
